

**Amendments to Cabinet Regulation No 235 ‘Requirements for the Circulation of Eggs in Small Quantities’ of 3 May 2017**

*Issued pursuant to the Law on the Supervision of the Handling of Food, Section 8(10) and 8(12), and Section 13(3)(3)*

Amend Cabinet Regulation No 235 ‘Requirements for the Circulation of Eggs in Small Quantities’ of 3 May 2017 (Latvijas Vēstnesis, 2017, No 89; 2018, No. 168) as follows:

1. Reword Paragraph 16 as follows:

‘16. Eggs shall be sold to the end consumer no later than 28 days after laying. Minimum shelf life of eggs of domestic fowl (*Gallus gallus*) shall be 28 days after laying.’

2. Reword Paragraph 18.6 as follows:

‘18.6. For eggs of domestic fowl (*Gallus gallus*), the farming method of laying hens shall be:

18.6.1. Organic: 0.

18.6.2. Free range: 1.

18.6.3. Barn: 2.

18.6.4. Cage: 3.’

3. Reword Paragraph 19 as follows:

‘19. Eggs from a flock of domestic fowl (*Gallus gallus*) that consists of more than 50 laying birds may be directly supplied to the end consumer, if they are labelled. The labelling of eggs shall include the following information:

19.1. A number for the farming method of laying hens (pursuant to Paragraph 18.6 of this Regulation).

19.2. Latvian Code (LV).

19.3. The registration number of the holding in the data centre.’

4. Reword the Annex (Annex).

**Information to be provided to a retail establishment on the producer and the  
type of egg production**

1. The name or business name of the egg producer.
2. The address of the holding and the registration number assigned by the Agricultural Data Centre.
3. Egg sales permit number.
4. The species of birds producing the eggs.
5. For eggs of domestic fowl (*Gallus gallus*), the farming method of laying hens:
  - 5.1. Organic: 0.
  - 5.2. Free range: 1.
  - 5.3. Barn: 2.
  - 5.4. Cage: 3.
6. Name and address of the customer (company).
7. Number of eggs supplied (pcs.).'
