6. Point 2 of the draft introduces a new restriction on the sale of alcoholic beverages containing more than 22% alcohol by volume in packages not exceeding 0.2 litres.

- This measure may lead to high costs for economic operators operating in the HoReCa industry and for which the cost of packaging is high, but also to an increased number of packaging with an environmental impact.

Point 3 of the draft introduces the obligation that alcoholic beverages purchased online should not be delivered to the purchaser earlier than six hours from the time of order.

- This provision is discriminatory in relation to traditional sales where the drinks are delivered as soon as the order is placed. It is also not clear how such a measure can be enforced in a situation where an online order can overlap its delivery beyond the six-hour limit, even during the closed sales period (10:00 p.m. to 8:00 a.m.). At the same time, there is no scientific explanation for the minimum 6-hour delivery interval of an online order that would lead to a decrease in alcohol consumption.

Point 4 of the draft provides for additional labelling requirements for alcoholic beverages, namely: a warning pictogram whose graphic form has not been established by the notified draft thus creating ambiguity in application. The same point also requires additional labelling on the nutrition declaration of alcoholic beverages, excluding small distilleries, for which only the warning pictogram is sufficient.

- This could be a discriminatory measure between economic operators which would distort competition in the Single Market.

We consider that the new restrictions introduced by Latvia violate the principle of free movement in the Single Market, distort competition between economic operators in the Member States and fragment the Single Market by creating new barriers to trade by imposing additional costs and negatively affecting the environment.

We believe that, with this draft, Latvia has not taken proportionate and adequate measures to achieve its public health objective, namely to reduce the consumption of alcoholic beverages, moreover this new regulation may create discrimination among economic operators operating in the sector, but also in related areas such as HoReCa, Tourism, etc. and may represent a disguised restriction of trade between Member States leading to the fragmentation of the Single Market.

The notified draft creates barriers to trade and discriminatory conditions in the offline and online market, but also between large and small economic operators in the Member States and creates a dangerous precedence in the regulation of the legislative framework.

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
