## REGULATORY IMPACT ASSESSMENT

### 1. What issue is being addressed?

Public demands and signals from organisations fighting alcoholism point to the easy availability of spirit drinks in small packages as an important factor in promoting and increasing alcohol consumption. Due to the appearance of spirit drinks in pouches confusingly resembling children's food packaging on the market, it is necessary to lay down requirements for the packaging of certain spirit drinks in such a manner that consumers shall not be misled as to the content of the packaging.

### 2. The recommended solution, including planned intervention tools, and expected impact

In order to supplement the commercial quality rules on the packaging of certain spirit drinks, it is necessary to regulate, by means of a regulation, the packaging of a nominal size of up to 200 millilitres used for certain spirit drinks.

It is therefore necessary to take legislative action to eliminate the use of packaging for spirit drinks that bears a striking resemblance to the packaging of food products intended for children (fruit mousses).

It is not possible to achieve the objective of the draft Regulation through non-legislative measures.

### 3. How has this problem been solved in other countries, in particular OECD/EU Member States?

The problem has not been identified in other EU Member States.

Public demands and signals from organisations fighting alcoholism point to the easy availability of spirit drinks in small packages, as an important factor in promoting and increasing alcohol consumption. In view of the recent appearance of alcohol in pouches confusingly resembling food products for children, it is necessary to regulate the rules the marking spirit drinks in such a manner that the packaging shall not mislead their consumers. In view of the above, the estimated duration of the public consultation shall be 3 days with the possibility of submitting written comments.

A table containing the comments submitted on the draft Regulation and a reference to these comments has been attached to the public consultation report (§ 51 of the Regulations of the Council of Ministers).
